Livingstonia Hospital Partnership (LHP)

The **LHP** supports the **David Gordon Memorial Hospital** which is one of five hospitals run by the Central Church Africa Presbyterian. It aims to benefit the local poor community by helping the hospital to continue to function and provide good care by supporting them financially, with equipment and training. The hospital is situated on top of the Livingstonia Plateau in Northern Malawi where malaria, aids, and respiratory diseases are the main causes of death. Maternal mortality is very high, one mother in every 120 dying during childbirth. It has 136 beds, four main wards, two theatres and a laboratory. (Website - www.livingstonia.org.uk)
